EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT



Thannarru,

It's been a busy few months here at Gumala. We started the new financial year and the team worked hard to process the 23-24 applications, ran many meetings and also attended and presented at 2 Indigenous conferences. We also planned and delivered Gumala's 26th AGM – our biggest yet!

THE NEW FINANCIAL YEAR

In July we said hello to the new financial year. We are happy that our Members have submitted applications and started using their new Program funds.

This year, we continued to offer the same categories of Fixed, Flexible and Other Programs as the 22-23 Program Guidelines. This familiarity with the Programs means Members can use the Program to their full potential.

Members have up to \$4,000 to spend on Flexible Programs over the 23-24 financial year, and over 55s received an additional \$1,000 to their Flexible balance at the beginning of the year. The Flexible Programs mean that Members can spend their flexible funds on what suits them best – and with 9 different programs to choose from, we really believe there is something for everyone.

GOOD GOVERNANCE

It's been a busy few months of meetings here at Gumala – we held two Traditional Owner Advisory Committee (TOAC) meetings, many Board Meetings, and a M&L (Monitoring and Liaison) meeting with Rio Tinto at the mine site.

These meetings are necessary for maintaining good governance and being compliant – but also play a key role in Gumala progressing strategically and ultimately working towards our mission of 'supporting and empowering Gumala Traditional Owners'.

Holding meetings on Country and visiting the mine site is particularly important. It takes us back to Gumala's origins and lets us reflect on the hard work and determination of our old people – something we never forget.

HOMELESSNESS WEEK

Gumala partnered with Pilbara Community Legal Service to apply for a grant to deliver an event for homelessness week. We were fortunate enough to be successful. Through the Lotterywest and Shelter WA grant and the help of local sponsors, we held a Homelessness week event in Port Hedland.

We know homelessness is an issue affecting many Australians, particularly Australians living in the regions so we worked with local service providers to provide a safe space to access support.

We worked with Aboriginal Family Legal Service, Bloodwood Tree, Yorgum Healing Services, and Youth Advisory Council to provide a welcoming event for people experiencing homelessness in Hedland. Community members were able to connect with services in a safe, relaxed setting, put faces to names and share their experience of finding secure housing with Shelter WA, who agreed to take their feedback to the Minister for Housing. We are hopeful this feedback will lead to change for the Hedland community and ultimately, our Membership.

SHARING AND LEARNING

Indigenous Empowerment Summit

Gumala had the privilege of attending and presenting at 2 Indigenous conferences. The Gumala team attended the Indigenous Empowerment Summit in Cairns, to connect and learn from similar Aboriginal organisations (like PBC's and other trusts). The team enjoyed hearing how other organisations worked through complex issues by using culture, collaboration and doing what's best for their community.

We also had the chance to share what Gumala is doing. Our Pilbara Regional Manager, Ashley Councillor, highlighted how Gumala's Programs are driven by Members needs and why this is so important.

SNAICC Conference

We also attended the SNAICC Conference on Larrakia Country (Darwin). This conference brings together Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander early childhood educators from across the nation.

Over 3 days, the team learned about different creative solutions to overcome barriers and social complexities. These sustainable approaches always create better outcomes for Indigenous children, which is why our 3a Early Learning program works so well.

We had the privilege of presenting information about Gumala's 3a Early Learning program at the conference. We spoke about how the Program benefits not only the children, but families. We enjoyed sharing how the program focuses on our children's development through:

- Capacity-building building up the confidence of parents in the Program and providing career pathways to interested parents
- Creating a culturally safe space by the program only having Aboriginal facilitators

We also spoke about how we have built relationships with the Department of Communities – Child Protection, to engage families in our service and keep that connection to culture and community.

GUMALA AGM

Thank you to all our Members who attended our AGM earlier this month, we loved seeing you tune in both online and in-person. We appreciate the time every Member puts aside to attend the AGM – whether that be by travelling a large distance or through logging in from home, we really appreciate your attendance.

The AGM is a very important event for us here at Gumala – it gives us the chance to hear your feedback and concerns, to connect, and update you on the year that has been.

3A IS BACK FOR TERM FOUR

A few weeks ago, our 3a Early Learning Centres opened for the final term of the year.

This term, each centre will focus on kindy transition, making portfolios for each child that will be attending kindy in 2024. Our aim is to build relationships with the children's future schools to help support these children with their transition.

Our 3a centres are for all Members and any Aboriginal families with children aged 0-4.

We provide a free service, indoor & outdoor play, free morning tea and coffee & tea making facilities for parents/carers.

Our centres are currently running from the following locations:

Karratha – 10 Hedland Place, Monday to Friday – 9am to 11.30am

South Hedland – 18 Mooring Loop, Monday to Friday – 9am to 11.30am

Roebourne – Gurlu Gurlu Maya Child & Parent Centre, Wednesdays & Thursdays 9am – 11.30am

North Tom Price - North Tom Price Primary School, Thursday & Friday 9am - 11.30am

Wakuthuni – Wakuthuni Community, Monday to Wednesday 9.30am – 12pm

Nullagine - Nullagine School, Monday to Friday 9am - 11:30am



THE 2023-24 EDUCATION PROGRAM IS HERE

The 23-24 Education Program (Kindy – Y12) starts 1 November 2023 and runs until 31 October 2024. The aim of the Education Program is to provide financial support for school-based costs. Gumala Children must be recognised as a Beneficiary of the Trust to access funding.

Funds available:

- Kindy Assistance \$500 per child for kindergarten students
- Primary Assistance \$2,000 per child for primary school students
- High School Assistance \$2,500 per child for high school students



How to access the Program:

- 1. Parents/caregivers need to complete the Student Registration form first *(this is only required when initially registering the child as a student)*
- 2. Once registered, Parents/caregivers complete the student application form
- 3. Parents/caregivers provide proof of enrolment for the current/new school year

Note: Proof of enrolment is only required once per school year. Where payments are being made direct to school or P&C enrolment is not required.





TRUST PERFORMANCE UPDATE





Gumala Investments Pty Ltd (GIPL), as Trustee for the General Gumala Foundation Trust (GGF), would like to advise the Beneficiaries that as of June 30, the assets held under investment had a total value of \$319.51 Million, with \$176 Million of those Investments held within the Future Fund. The net value of the Future Fund, after factoring in liabilities, totalled \$174.81 Million.




June 30th marked the end of the 2022-2023 Financial Year, allowing GIPL to look back at the performance of the Trust over the last 12 months.


For the June Quarter, revenue received under the YLUA was \$0.81 Million, bringing us to a total of \$22.41 Million for the 2023 Financial Year. This amount was less than the previous financial year by \$10.1 Million.

On a positive note, Investment revenue has continued to increase. The June Quarter's Investment revenue was \$3.75 Million, bringing the yearly total up to \$10.29 for the 2023 Financial Year, which is an increase of \$2.48 Million from last year's total Investment Revenue.


The Global Investment Market did fluctuate throughout the year, which is normal, and can result in the value of our short-term investments going up and down across the year. However, we prefer to take a long-term view on investments, as their growth patterns across several years shows their true performance.



Across the Foundation, Gumala spent \$9.83 Million on Operating and Capital costs over the Financial Year. These costs include operating costs of both GAC and GIPL, as well as consultation and travel payments for Gumala Joint Consultation and AGMs



This left \$22.87 Million to be used for Member Program Funding and Investment into the Future Fund, for the benefit of Gumala Beneficiaries.




The GGF spent \$4.48 Million on Member Program Funding during the June Quarter, which brings the total spent for the 2023 Financial Year to \$19.17 Million.
